THE SECOND TIER

Of ranchos south of those named, were, first, Tom McGoldrick with two partners, McGraw and Lee, occupied the place south of the "house that Jack built," next in order were the ranchos of John Larson and the Starar brothers, Jacob and Andrew. The --st (letters of word blurred) crops raised the first year of the settlement were by J. McColdrink and the Starar brothers.

Jacob Starr (sic)--One of the pioneers of Salt River. Has 100 acres 1 mile southeast of town. Has 4 acres in alfalfa, 6 acres wheat, cut for chicken feed, 2 acres barley, cut for hay, 2 acres grapes and 60 fruit trees.
